AFC WIMBLEDON

AFC Wimbledon Women were founded in 2003 when the ladies' team representing Wimbledon FC decided to transfer following the old club's relocation.

From 2003 to 2006, the side was one of the few Women's Premier League teams not to be affiliated with a club from the Premier League or Football League. After finishing third in what is now the FA Women's National League Southern Division in their opening season, a fifth place and seventh place finish came before a relegation in the 2006/07 campaign.

Back-to-back relegations meant that the Dons would play their football in the London and South

East Women's Regional Football League for nearly a decade. After surviving near-relegation in multiple seasons, promotion back into the Women's National League came in 2016 and after eight years in the fourth tier, a champion season secured their place in the third tier for this campaign.

Through 20 games, Wimbledon sit mid-table on 27 points thanks to eight wins and three draws. In the fixture earlier in 2025, at Plough Lane, Argyle came away as victors. Two Charlotte Whitmore goals, with the winner coming with potentially the final kick of the game, handed the Greens three points.



Player OF THE MONTH

Forward Charlotte Whitmore has been voted Argyle Women's Player of the Month for March.

After scoring at Portman Road in front of nearly 11,000 fans against Ipswich Town, the Argyle number seven picks up her fourth monthly award of the season, so far.

Charlotte won the supporters' vote with 49% of the poll, ahead of Roxy Thomas (23%), Ella Stephens (18%) and Caitlin Smith (9%).

Whitmore said: "I want to start by saying a massive thank you to my fellow teammates, staff and fans for the continued support this season.

"I am honoured to win this award for the fourth time this year, however, it's full credit to the people supporting and pushing me to do my best. I look forward to continuing the hard work on Sunday for our last home game of the season at Home Park in front of the Green Army."
