Refunds/Exchanges

We regret to inform you that refunds and exchanges are unavailable, except in the unlikely event that the concert is cancelled, and an alternative date cannot be offered.

We strongly advise purchasing tickets only from official ticket providers due to a significant increase in ticketing scams.

Digital Wallet Tickets

Adding your tickets to a digital wallet is optional and not required for entry. However, it can help prevent issues related to internet connectivity at the venue. If you encounter difficulties adding your tickets, you can still access them via the website where your purchase was made.



ACCESSIBILITY

Accessibility Tickets

A complimentary companion ticket is available under certain circumstances and on provision of supporting documents, these include:

Receipt of Higher rate of Disability Living Allowance (mobility or care component).

Receipt of Enhanced rate PIP (Personal Independence Payment).

A personal letter from your GP explaining that support is required and why.

Accessible Entry Lanes

Please talk to a member of staff at the venue if you have a disability or medical requirement that means you cannot queue. There is an accessible entry lane available as soon as the doors open via the purple entrance.

Assistance Dogs

Assistance dogs are welcome at the stadium but please advise the venue at least seven days before the concert. Please contact: disability@pafc.co.uk for more information.

Due reference will be given to all aspects of safety and guidance from Guide Dogs UK to ensure safety within the Stadium.

Accessible Parking

Accessible parking is available at Milehouse Park and Ride on a first-come, first-served basis.

Accessible parking can also be found at all major car parks and park-andride sites. We recommend planning your journey in advance to avoid any inconvenience.

Accessible Toilet Facilities

There are specially adapted toilets located in the Babcock Devonport End, Portcullis Legals Lyndhurst Road Stand and Beacon Electrical Mayflower Grandstand. Each of these toilets is alarmed. Accessible toilets can be accessed with radar keys and stewards hold a spare key if required.

If you experience any problems with the use of the accessible toilets, please contact the nearest steward.

SAFEGUARDING CHILDREN

At Relive at Argyle, the safety and wellbeing of children are our top priority. Please take note of the following safeguarding measures in place:

Children Must Be Accompanied

All children under 16 must be accompanied by a responsible adult (18+).

Lost Child Procedure

If a child becomes separated from their guardian, they should report to the nearest steward or the Event Information Point (located outside the Lyndhurst Stand). Stewards are trained to assist and will follow the venue's safeguarding procedures.

Wristbands for Contact Info

Parents/guardians are encouraged to write their contact number on their child's event wristband to ensure a quick response if needed.

Security & DBS-Checked Staff

Event security and designated safeguarding officers will be present throughout the venue. All staff responsible for child welfare are DBS-checked.

Photography & Media

Official event photography will take place. If you do not wish for your child to be photographed, please inform a member of staff at the event entrance.

Getting to the Stadium

There are several ways to travel to Home Park:

Walking: The stadium is easily accessible via Central Park from the city centre.

Cycling: Bike parking is available around the stadium, and Beryl Bikes can be hired from the city centre.

Bus: Regular services pass the stadium via Alma Road and Outland Road/ Milehouse. Please check City Bus and Stagecoach for schedules.

Park & Ride Services

There will be shuttle buses back to the city centre after the event.

Please use City Centre Parking, as the Park & Ride locations will be locked after hours.

By Train

Plymouth Railway Station is a 15-20 minute walk through Central Park to Home Park (uphill but scenic).

Alternatively, it's a 5-minute taxi ride.

Please check with train operators for any updates to schedules.


Post-Event Bus Information

Heading back into town after the event?

Buses will be running at the following times:

Departing from Milehouse Park & Ride (near the Jack Leslie statue): 9.45pm, 10.15pm, 11.45pm

Arriving at Royal Parade: 9.55pm, 10.25pm, 22.55pm



Will there be extra bars and toilets?

Exciting news! We've increased the number of bars for this year's concert! In addition to the concourse, there will be extra food and drink outlets available to all attendees. To help reduce waiting times, we'll be offering two-pint cups and have boosted staff numbers. If one bar has a long queue, we encourage you to try others with shorter wait times. Thank you for your patience!

Can I bring food and drink into the venue?

Food and drink are not permitted to be brought into the venue. If you have a medical condition such as diabetes, then a doctor's note will permit dietspecific food and drink only. A range of food and drink will be available to purchase at the venue. Please email: disability@pafc.co.uk for more information.

Home Park Stadium is a cashless venue – all transactions will be via card.

Is the concert seated?

The concert may be either seated or standing, depending on the type of ticket purchased. Please check your ticket for details.

Is the concert outdoors?

Yes, the concert will take place on the pitch at Home Park Stadium.

If it rains, will the concert still go ahead?

Yes, the concert will go ahead in the rain so please come prepared. Please bring clothing appropriate to expected weather conditions.

Visitors with medical requirements

If you need to bring medication or medical equipment, this is permitted. Should you wish to notify the venue in advance for added peace of mind, please contact disability@pafc.co.uk with details of the event you are attending.

Can I bring a bag?

Yes, but only one small bag per person (maximum size A4: Height 297mm (11.7 inches), Width 210mm (8.27 inches), Depth 210mm (8.27 inches)).

Please note there are no bag drop facilities at this event.

All bags will be subject to a search. To speed up entry, we encourage you to avoid bringing a bag if possible.

First aid

First aid facilities will be available on-site, with a dedicated team on hand should you require assistance.

Photography

Professional audio and visual recording equipment is not permitted within the venue.

Filming and flash photography are prohibited during the concert. Cameras deemed 'professional' will be confiscated and held until the end of the event.

DO'S AND DON'TS

Do's

Do keep your belongings with you at all times.

Do allow ample time to take advantage of the toilet facilities.

Do bring clothing appropriate to the weather conditions.

Do put any rubbish in the bins provided for you.

Do look out for official vendors and concessions stalls.

Do avoid unlicensed traders outside of the venue offering inferior goods.

Do report anything suspicious to a member of staff.

Do tune into local radio ϑ check social media for the latest travel updates.

Don'ts

Don't bring food or drink into the venue.

Don't arrive with any form of professional audio or visual recording equipment. There will be security checks in place and items may be confiscated if necessary.

Don't bring large bags.

Our concert venue's flooring is not suitable for heels. We recommend wearing flat shoes if you plan to attend the concert.

Smoking

The stadium is smoke-free and smoking and the use of electronic cigarettes and vapes is not permitted anywhere inside the Ground. There will be a smoking area at the event.

Toilets

All customers have easy access to toilet facilities, including wheelchair-accessible toilets. This year, we have increased the number of available toilets to reduce wait times. If you encounter a long queue, please feel free to explore alternative nearby facilities.

Umbrellas

Umbrellas are not permitted.

Payment

Home Park Stadium is a cashless venue. Please make sure you bring a card or have Apple/Google Pay setup to your phone


National Study in safety & security at music events

PROHIBITED ITEMS

- Airhorns or other loud instrument
- Alcohol
- Animals/pets (service animals permitted)
- Any item which could be used as a weapon and/or compromise public safety
- Anything likely to cause injury or harm
- Audio recording devices
- Bottles
- Canes (mobility canes are permitted)
- Cans
- Dangerous or hazardous items
- Drones
- Drugs and drug paraphernalia
- Fireworks, including sparklers
- Flares
- Flags on poles

- Flammables
- Food
- Glass vessels
- Knives
- Laser devices
- Poles
- Professional cameras or video recording equipment
- Promotional items (including flyers, samples, giveaways)
- Sharp objects such as knives or scissors
- Selfie sticks/tripods
- Smoke bombs, canisters or similar
- Torches
- Weapons of any kind (including replicas)
- Umbrellas

All persons attending can expect to be searched. Search is a condition of entry. Detection dogs will be present at this event.

Any person in possession of prohibited items may be refused entry.

Where applicable, items may be passed to the police for further investigation.
