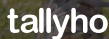

Hi everyone, welcome to today's game against Bridgwater United here at Home Park.

We extend a welcome to all of the coaches, players, officials and supporters of Bridgwater to Plymouth today. Wishing you all a safe trip home afterwards.

This is our second game in the FAWNL Cup group stage; we won the first, on Thursday night, 5-1 against Marine Academy Plymouth. We went a goal down in the game, down to our own poor play really, and we were 2-1 up at the break.

To that point, we had not been our clinical selves, but we had a bit of a word at half-time, and in the second half we played with better intensity, better patterns, and scored three more goals to pull clear.

We have not had loads of time to prepare for today, as the MAP game was less than three days ago, but the benefit it is that games coming along like this means we can rotate, and get some minutes into different players.

I was pleased to be able to give Sienna Gilbert her debut on Thursday. Sienna is only 16, but is talented, and has a terrific attitude. It is good knowing that players like Sienna, and more like her, are waiting in our pathway.

Opposition

BRIDGWATER UNITED

Founded in 1990, Bridgwater play in the FA Women's National League Division One South West, one division below Argyle.

Following promotion in 2016, the club competed at the top flight of English football in the Women's Super League during the 2017 and 2018–2019 seasons, under the Yeovil Town name. In 2021, the team merged with men's side Bridgwater Town to become Bridgwater United, but separated in 2024 to become an independent women's club under the same name.

The team was formed by Tony Baverstock as Yetminster Ladies, and originally competed in South West League Division Two, with the club's first game being against Weymouth Vikings on 16 September 1990. The club was renamed Sherborne Ladies in 1993, and in 1997 the team reached the 4th Round of the Women's FA Cup, finally going out to Everton in front of a crowd of over 500 at Huish Park. The team was renamed Yeovil Town in 1999, and progressed well under the management of John Flatters. After Flatters departed the club, first-team coach Steve Phelps took over.

Over the next two decades, several items of silverware fell into the hands of those in charge of Yeovil Town - four Somerset FA Women's Senior Cups, two South West Combination League titles, and the most famous victory, the FA WSL 2 title in 2016.

In March 2019, the club was reported to have entered administration. They were deducted 10 points during the 2018/19 season, finishing 15 points adrift and getting relegated.

Now named Bridgwater, the side compete in the fourth tier and have started their campaign with a win, a draw, and a loss in three games, sitting in fifth place, on the same points as Marine Academy Plymouth.

Beatrix Kretteis is the club's top scorer through the three games with two goals, whilst Ellie-Mae Bell, Hannah Price and Manfy Sharpe have all added a goal each.



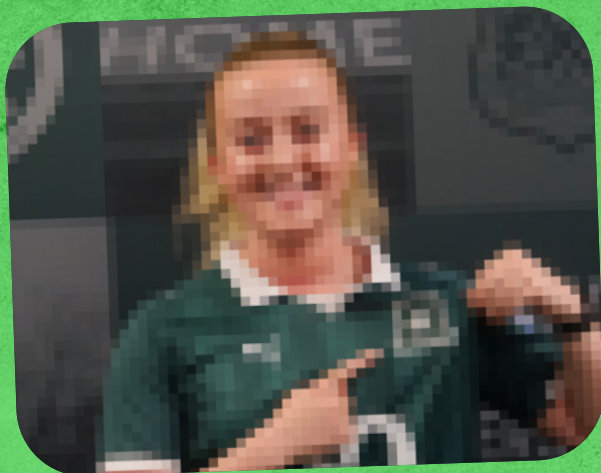
