GROUP STAGES

Argyle started their FAWNL Cup campaign in September, with a 5-1 victory against Marine Academy Plymouth.

Goals from Phoebie Poole, Roisin Kivel, Charlotte Whitmore, Olivia Francis, and an own goal propelled the Greens to victory at Erme Valley, the home of lvybridge Town.

Despite Argyle having most of the possession through the opening stages of the tie and creating chances in and around the MAP final third, it was the hosts that took the lead in the 21st minute, through Skye Macdonald-Brown.

However, from that point, Argyle did not look back and stormed to victory confidently.

The second tie saw the Greens host Bridgwater United at Home Park, and a replica result of the opening game ensued.

An Imy Crawford brace and goals from Francis, Poole, and Whitmore helped secure the victory for Argyle in PL2, with the visitors' consolation goal coming two minutes from the full-time whistle, as Connie Pengelly converted a spot-kick.

Marie Hourihan's side still needed to secure a result away from home, against Bristol Rovers, in the final group stage game to confirm a spot in the knockout stages, and they did exactly that.

Katie Wilson's first-half free-kick, goals from Katie Dickson, Tianna Teisar, Giota Papaioannou and a Francis brace, handed Argyle an emphatic 6-0 victory over the Gas in Yate.

FIRST ROUND

Argyle secured progression into the last 16 of the FA Women's National League Cup with a 3-0 win away to Watford in October.

Another Francis brace and Tianna Teisar's goal propelled the Greens to a comfortable and professional victory against the Golden Girls at the Orbital Fasteners Stadium.

Confident play was on show from Marie Hourihan's side from the get-go, with multiple chances coming in front of goal for the Greens' frontline. Watford, however, were able to block efforts from Teisar, Poole and others in the opening stages of the first half, but could not stop Argyle taking the lead, through Francis, just minutes before the break.

Teisar's close-range finish and a tidy across-goal strike from Francis in the opening seven minutes of the second 45 stunned Watford, with controlled play and defending pushing Argyle to victory and setting up the tie against Oxford United.

Founded in 2005, Oxford United have been a feature in the women's football set-up in England. Featuring as one of the inaugural members of the Women's Championship in 2014, the U's spent several years in the league but were relegated to the FA Women's National League Southern Premier Division for the 2018/19 season, the same year Argyle got promoted back into the league.

From that point, the two have battled it out, albeit typically on different sides of the table, but this does not mean that the ties were not close between the two sides. Two seasons ago, the FA Cup third-round game at Coach Road was one that people will never forget. Argyle came away as penalty victors after Imy Crawford's goal in extra time handed the Greens the lifeline they needed.

In both league fixtures last season, Oxford came away victorious, with a 3-1 victory at Home Park and a 1-0 triumph at the RAW Charging Stadium.


Sam Rose was Oxford Women's first-ever full-time First Team Manager, joining the team in November 2023, but left the role via mutual consent at the end of October. Rose worked as an assistant manager for Women's Super League side Aston Villa, and guided Oxford to 44 points and fifth in the table in his first season in charge.

Oxford have now turned to the current backroom staff to lead the side in the interim, with coach Shaun Green taking the lead, whilst the U's sit in seventh in the league table on 11 points.

A 4-0 victory over Chelsea Academy in the first round of the cup set up the tie against Argyle at Home Park this weekend. Those with a keen eye on the fixtures will have noticed that the Greens travel to Oxfordshire next weekend, to face the U's again, but this time in league play.



Argyle Women's forward Tianna Teisar has been voted the club's Player of the Month for October.
